STEP 1: Articles Collection(Contenders)

- Articles Collection
 - NASOM physicians were asked to contribute articles *please put yourself in the position of a 4th year GIM fellow who is relatively new to Obstetric Medicine.*

Articles should:

- Be applicable to a large number of patients.
 - Help to guide clinical practice.
 - Be evidence based or represent a consensus.
- 37 CONTENDER articles recommended by 14 physicians
 - Many physicians recommended similar articles this year

Step 2: Survey for Scoring Articles

14 NASOM OBMED physicians completed survey

- Instructions suggested that high scores be based on:
 - HIGH YIELD information:
 - stuff that GIM fellows need to know.
 - EVIDENCE/Consensus statements/practice guidance that influence management
- When scoring articles remember when you started in OBMED:
 - The need to get to the BASICS and best practices FAST.
 - The anxiety in transitioning to the care of pregnant patient

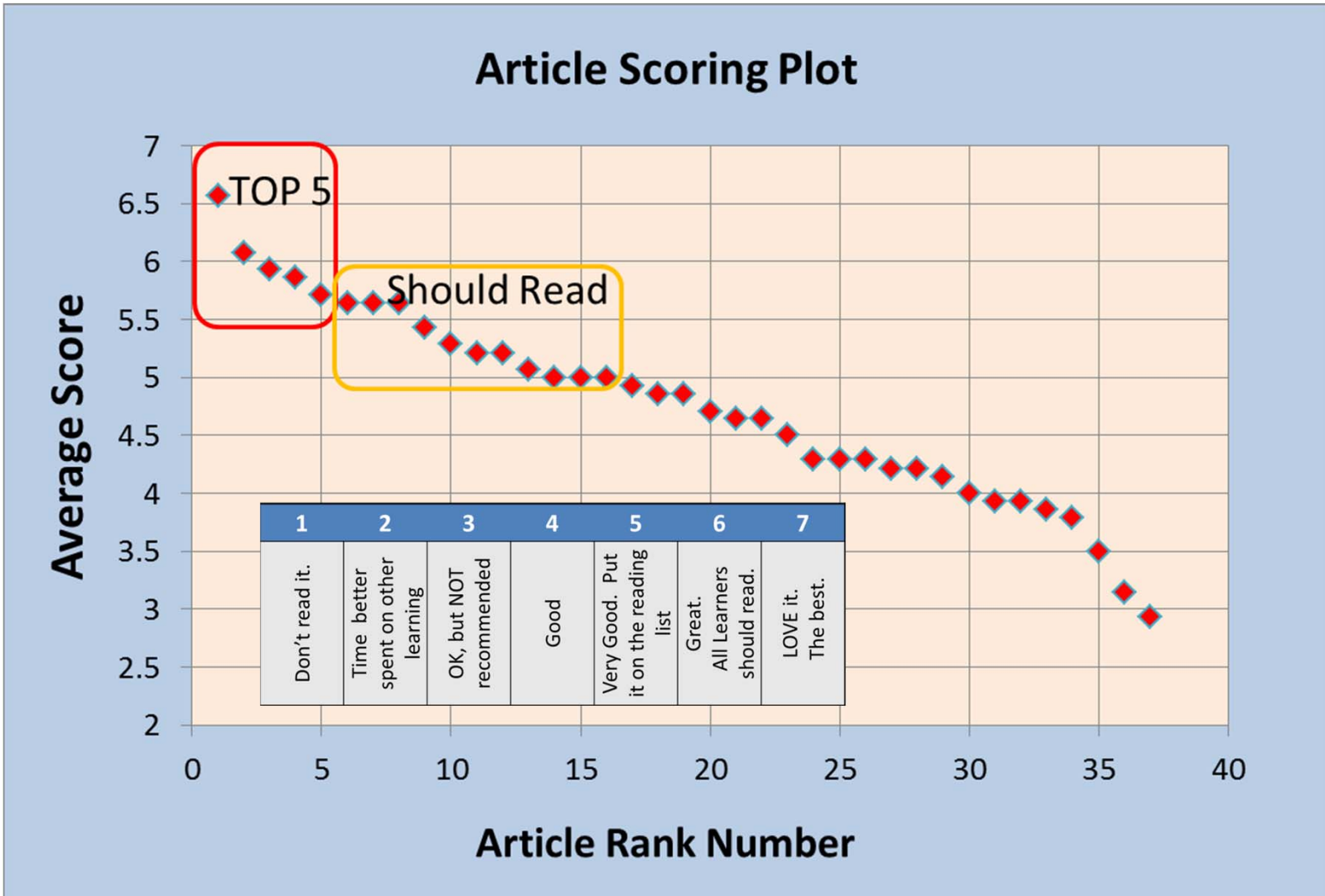
